Sine ira et studio. New Readings of Soviet Literature and Cinematography

Venue and date: Warsaw, 15-16 May 2015

Languages: Polish, Russian, English

The aim of the conference is to take a new look at the literature and cinematography of the USSR. The time that has passed since its fall allows us to ask questions regarding the possibility and necessity of reviving studies into this period, i.e. the possibility and necessity of providing new readings of (seemingly) well-researched subjects but also of extending the research field to include subjects that have so far rarely been investigated. By considering the relevance of Soviet literary and film works with and without reference to the social and political changes that have happened over the past two decades, and also by comparing these works with other works of culture, we will be able to discuss the opinions of various researchers, critics, and others regarding the legacy of that period.

The conference is addressed to BA, MA and PhD students as well as to other researchers interested in the subject, who represent various fields of the humanities and social studies, i.e. literature, film, and culture researchers as well as historians, philosophers, sociologist, etc.

Topic areas:

- 1. The latest readings of Soviet literature and cinematography:
 - reinterpretations and revisions of the existing analyses,
 - new aspects and unknown creators.
- 2. Soviet literature and cinematography in the light of the latest theories and methodological approaches:
 - historic, cultural, gender, and postcolonial and other perspectives,

- inter-, trans-, and multidisciplinary approaches.
- 3. The place of Soviet literature and cinematography in the present day:
- the dialogue between young authors / film makers and the Soviet canon (references, inspirations, polemics),
 - the reception of Soviet literature and cinematography in the 21st century.

We plan to publish a peer-reviewed monograph adhering to current publishing standards.
