

KEYNOTE

US Europe – this title alludes to three associations:

First, it is about European identity: we Europeans; we in Europe. This identity cannot only be defined with the cultural achievements of the past in mind, but it also requires dealing with heterogeneity and cosmopolitanism. Europe and what makes it unique have spread across the world, but elements of the world have also expanded into the towns and villages of Europe.

Second, it is about the future shape of Europe, about the United States of Europe: What types are imaginable, but also of the repertoire of possible ways of structuring it and of limiting the European configuration.

Third, it is about Europe's position as part of a world system, and thus its relationship to others. Whereas the United States was traditionally an important partner for Europe, now new geo-political areas play a more important role. The Muslim world and "Chinindia" (China and India) have taken on new geopolitical importance. In this perspective, the question also has to be raised as to the special characteristics and future chances of

Therefore, the question of Europe's positioning in a globalized world is also posed. This not only requires consideration of its own unique characteristics and location, but also reflection on the organizational structures and the definition of its role in the international system of powers. The usual topics, from migration to the ageing population, from identity to hybridity, from European statehood up to global empire, from the new phase of oppression to a world society, are incorporated into these questions.
