Banat and Transylvania in Middle Ages. In the framework of the Hungarian state. Romanian aristocracy and peasantry. Feudal relations. Wallachia and Moldavia between the Ottomans and Hungary. The first clashes with the Turks. Duke Mircea. Vlad Tepes. The development of historiography 17th - 18th century. Medieval chroniclers of Moldova. Historiography in XIX century
